Wylam's Hidden Heritage Guided Walk

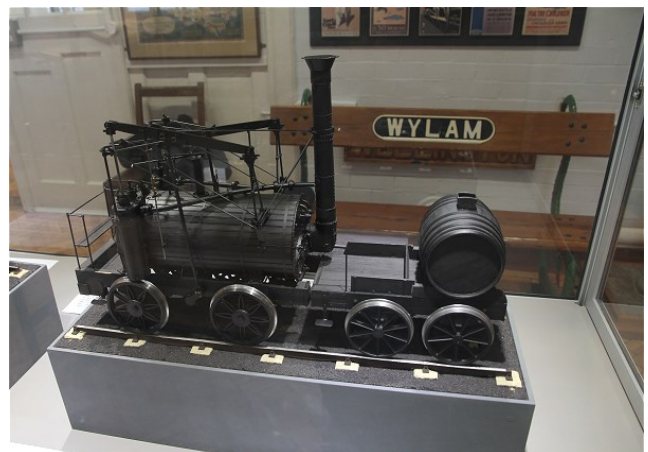
Including visit to Wylam Railway Museum & George Stephenson's Birthplace

As a special one-off (though we hope it will be repeated), the National Trust with the Parish Council is organising a guided walk, highlighting Wylam's hidden (and not so hidden) industrial heritage, starting at 10.00 am from Charlie's Corner and finishing about 11.30am (though may be a bit later if we linger). No charge.

This will take in Wylam Railway Museum, specially open for the day 10.00am to 2.00pm, and also a visit (inside) to the cottage where George Stephenson was born, along the Waggonway towards Newburn. Trust staff will be at the property to answer questions and update us on the research work they have been doing.
